NEWS FROM THOSE WE SUPPORT

Telile (Light of Hope) - Beginning in January, we will be have an emphasis to raise \$2520 for desks for Telile's schools in Ethiopia. There are 5 schools that are in use, but have no desks, children sit on the floor or bring rocks or pieces of wood to sit on. Each desk seats 3 children and costs \$80. The emphasis will run until the total is raised.

Brian and Julie O'Herin (SLI - Wycliffe) - Brian will be travelling to Russia in April or May to meet with translators and do a consultant check on three Old Testament books being translated. These are Esther, Ruth and Jonah. If all is well they will be ready for publication.

Dennis Smith (South America) - Dennis and Maribel presented news of their work in South America where Dennis has responsibility for facilitating mission work for the entire continent. He has contact with and assistance from several denominations for his work. He emphasized ministries in Colombia, Venezuela and Argentina during their visit Dec. 17.

The Yorks (Cru - Athletes in Action) - Erik spent his first week on site in Ohio, he says:" (I'll be traveling to AIA headquarters one week a month until we move there next summer) and I had the opportunity of meeting with some of our staff at Ohio State University."

John & Gwenda (IMCK - Congo) - The Fletchers noted thanks in their latest newsletter for donations for:

- Indigent patients
- Special scholarships to medical and education personnel
- Maintenance of the power plant
- Retirement benefits for personnel
- Funds for the Endowment Fund, to date \$462,607 has been raised toward the goal of \$2 million.

STEWARDSHIP UPDATE

To date we have received \$99,480 in pledges from 25 people. We are very grateful for their generosity. Last year by the end of January there were 31 pledges for a total of \$125,242. We have lost a few members and friends but have gained some as well.

We will have a new pastor early in 2018 and there will be increased personnel costs. Even after reworking the budget several times there is still a gap of about \$40,000 between the expected income and expected expenses. While there are some reserve funds available they will last for only a limited time and some of the accumulated endowment earnings are already in the budget.

We hope additional pledges will come in to support the new pastor and the activities of the church. If you have been waiting to decide about pledging, please consider it again. If you need a pledge card or an envelope, they are in the narthex or in the office.






