#### News from our Mission Partners:

**Light of Hope -** Taliilee says: Our translation team is working on the edition work of the translated version into Arsi Oromo with the Bible consultant from Wycliffe Ethiopia since March 2017. They have already completed 11 of the 39 books and 28 books to go. Our plan is to complete the edition by the end of 2018 and make it ready for publishing in 2019 or sooner.

**Wycliffe SIL** – Brian says: I have been focused almost exclusively on the book of Esther for the last month or so, but I also need to compile the introduction for the book of Jonah. We have made the revisions, but they are in several different places, and it is up to me to bring them together.

**CRU** – Erik reports: AIA has pioneered a worldview experience that is helping Cru as a whole go after our whole gospel scope and overcome ethnic barriers. As it is required training for the whole AIA division, I experienced it with 15 of our new staff. "The Lenses Institute is a five-day intensive training that aims to help the Church fight for Oneness by influencing the way Christian leaders see, understand, and act in our ethnically and culturally diverse world."

**Smiths** - Dennis says "We're especially excited that February 1-2, 2019 the IPC will host representatives of the churches and presbyteries that have active mission partnerships in Colombia, the Presbyterian Peace Fellowship (PPF) and World Mission to breathe new life into the Colombia Mission Network. Let me know if you'd like to join us!"

**\*Tierra Nueva –** The latest newsletter reports: "We're growing in our inter-ministry collaboration. We draw from weekly staff prayer, on-site training with The People's Seminary, and pastoral advocacy. We continually equip and strengthen shepherds who are adept at seeking, finding, and gathering people affected by incarceration, addiction, and immigration."


