FROM THE REV. CHRIS MURPHY

Entering Our 2nd Year Together!

As we enter the month of February as a congregation, I am celebrating my one-year anniversary as your pastor. Anniversaries are good times to reflect and vision for the future. At our recent Annual Meeting, I invited you to share different highlights from this last year. You mentioned many things, including the presence of younger people at our church and the new optimism we feel as a congregation.

I also took some time to share five goals I have for us this year. As a reminder, the five goals are:

- Devote ourselves to prayer as we vision for the future. Our prayer group on the first Sunday of each month will be one key team to help us reach this goal. I also encourage all of us to deepen our intimacy with God through spiritual practices like prayer, bible study, journaling, and service.
- 2. Live out our mission as a church of Grace, Hope, and Love in Newberg. This will include our global and local mission to people on the margins. Grace suggests our church is a place to find refreshment and a non-judgmental environment to receive forgiveness and rest. Hope speaks to our desire to be a positive community that is optimistic about the future and God's work in our lives. Love is a word that expresses our deepest longing in life. We want to feel loved by God and others and to demonstrate God's love to a world in need.
- 3. **Focus on children, youth, and young adults.** We are called to grow younger by empowering young people and by staying young at heart. This will include new outreach efforts to families in our neighborhood and continued partnership with George Fox University.
- 4. **Value intergenerational relationships.** As we focus on the young, we also seek to create bridges for people of all generations to support one another. We will continue to especially care for those who are homebound and those who are preparing to enter heaven soon.
- 5. **Increase our income streams.** This means we need to look for ways to rent our facilities and to explore how best to use our back lot to enhance our mission and strengthen our financial support. We will develop a plan for fundraising efforts to support our sustainability as a community for years to come.

Thank you for a wonderful first year as your pastor! As we follow the leading of the Holy Spirit and stay committed to our mission to be a church of Grace, Hope, and Love in Newberg, God will guide our steps and surprise us with good things.

Mission & Global Witness Special Pew News

Tierra Nueva is our new partner for 2019, this is a profile of some of their mission activities:

Worshipping Community We gather on Sundays at 4:30 pm at our building to worship, share prayer, hear the message, share communion, and celebrate unity.

Family Support Center Mondays and Wednesdays from 11:00 am to 4:00 pm. We open our building and resources (food, clothing, info on local food banks and organizations). Staff provide prayer and pastoral support.

Pastoral Advocacy Staff walks alongside our community, providing pastoral support through spiritual, practical, holistic means. We practice unconditional love and patience, and often speak on behalf of the powerless.

The People's Seminary We train ministry workers to bring Good News where they are in God's Kingdom. This theological training addresses the illusory gap between the mainstream church and the marginalized.

Jail Ministry Our chaplains bring the Gospel to Skagit Community Justice Center and Munroe Correctional Facility, often finding/following those we know from Pastoral Advocacy and FSC.

Gospels and Psalms Group We gather every morning to read Gospels and every evening to read Psalms. Our community uses this regular community to provide support to each other. Pastor Julio anoints all who attend.
