FROM THE REV. CHRIS MURPHY- Investing in the Future

September is here and we are ready to start another school year in Newberg. As Fall begins, we also are beginning a special season in **Newberg First Presbyterian Church's** history. On **September 15th**, we will officially launch the *Investing in the Future Church Capital Campaign*. A few months ago, we had a congregational vote and unanimously supported moving in this direction. We are beginning a **\$230,000 3-year campaign** that will strengthen the work of our church for years to come and will help ensure our future in Newberg.

Our Investing in the Future Capital Campaign will be used to support five areas.

- 1. Pay off the mortgage of the Christian Education Building.
- 2. Strengthen our facilities with necessary repairs and improvements.
- 3. Fund creative mission efforts that will lead to effective outreach to younger families and neighborhood engagement.
- 4. We will tithe approximately 10 percent of our fundraising to support our mission partners and local mission efforts. This will include helping to raise funds for a new school in Ethiopia.
- 5. We wish to give a special financial gift to support a future retirement fund for our Music Director, Pat Goodman, who continues to bless us with her musical gifts.

In order to prepare us for this exciting campaign, we are hosting four lunches after church. We are encouraging every regular attender from our congregation to sign up for one of these lunches to learn more about the details of the campaign. These lunches will take place on **Sept. 15**th, **Sept. 29**th. **October 13**th, **and October 27**th. You can sign up in the Fellowship Hall or by calling the church office.

I am excited to also begin a new sermon series in September on the **new mission statement** of our church. Our new mission statement reads, "We are a Christ-centered church of Grace, Hope, and Love committed to mission in Newberg and throughout the world." To help unpack the depth of this mission, I will be preaching on the different words of our mission statement throughout the month of September.

Friends, Jesus Christ is actively guiding the mission of our church and is preparing us to grow in our experience of Grace, Hope, and Love in new ways. Thank you for joining us in this movement!

Taliilee & Urgessa



Taliilee and Urgessa are the principal facilitators of Light of Hope Ministry Ethiopia (LOHME) in Ethiopia. Taliilee is active with Arsi Oromo people in major cities in the US and also supporting Urgessa in building schools in Ethiopia. Their goal is to add two more schools this year to already existing 52, built over the past years.

LOHME is a partner organization with Frontier Fellowship. LOHME is reaching out to over 10 million Arsi Oromo people. The ministry approach is holistic, focusing on literacy, health, church planting, Bible translation and evangelism among this Muslim people group. Teams of teacher-evangelists are trained and sent to villages that want a school in their community. Teachers build peaceful relationships between Muslims and emerging followers of Jesus and seek to plant churches that reflect the forms and traditions of the local culture. LOHME also trains nurses and other health professionals to work in village health stations while sharing the Gospel with the communities they serve. Donated funds help build and furnish village schools and Light of Hope Academy, a Christian training college for nurses.

The latest Presbytery of the Cascades meeting was held June 28-29 at First Presbyterian, Ashland, Oregon. Elise Prayzich and Sylvia Stater represented Newberg FPC.

The meeting began with recognition of the Shasta and Klamath native peoples, upon whose land the meeting was held. Representatives of the local peoples prayed and sang in their native languages.

Youth Triennium: seven youth and four adults, representing a larger group of 39 youth/13 adults, were commissioned to attend the gathering at Purdue University, Indiana, in July. Two candidates for the ministry were approved for ordination, after answering questions from Presbytery attendees. Aaron Pratt Shepherd, PhD, has accepted a call in Massachusetts, and Morgan Schmidt will continue her work with 'youth and 20-somethings' in Bend.

Presbytery acted to approve minimum compensation for 2020, with a recommended 2.8% cost-of-living increase. No action taken to retroactively mandate that all ministries in the Cascades Presbytery receive sabbaticals after 6 years. COM (Committee on Ministry) will bring back a motion at a future meeting.

Dinner on Friday was served by the Community Dinner Team from First Presbyterian, Phoenix. Many thanks to them: a freewill offering was made to help them in their ministry.

Presbytery retains \$100,000 available for peacemaking efforts. Any church may apply. Bisbee grant funds are directed toward mental health – food, medications, depression support. Small grants are available.

A variety of workshops were held, including one by Rob Hagan, who has visited Newberg FPC, on Stewardship and techniques for building funds to support the work of the church. Another was a presentation on peacemaking efforts in Rwanda, and St. Andrews' work in Cuba. A taizé service was held Friday evening.

The next Presbytery meeting shall be held November 15-16, at Southminster, in Beaverton. Anyone can attend, but each church has only 2 votes, held by commissioned elders.
