## THE CONTEMPORARY CHURCH **1859-PRESENT**

### **Context: The American Synthesis** 1776-1859

Not a Christian Nation but a nation of "Christians" **Official separation of Church and State** Christian churches of various denominations.... most based on the Nicene Creed

Gradually becomes the ideal in the Western world as we move through the 19th and 20th centuries


## The intellectual challenge

Charles Darwin 1809-1882


The Origin of Species 1859 His proposition that all species of life have evolved over time from common ancestors gradually became widely accepted, and is considered today a foundational concept in science...






Karl Marx 1818-1883 German philosopher, economist, historian, sociologist, political theorist, journalist and socialist revolutionary. but...Christian upbringing

"The Union of the Faithful with Christ, according to St. John 15:1-14, presented in its Reason and Essence, in its Absolute Necessity and its Effects."

Marx notices that corruption and alienation are present in humankind to an intolerable and terrifying degree. No matter how much human beings strive, they know themselves to be incapable of achieving their purpose without divine help. So he depicts human beings as creatures at the mercy of their vices, saved only by the mercy of God. Without God people are helpless; with God they become divine....but they didn't so became disillusioned



psychology is defined as "the scientific study of behavior and mental processes"

## Sigmund Freud—*Psychology* 1856-1939

Freud's family were Jewish but he was himself non-practicing.

In 1873, Freud began to study medicine at the University of Vienna.

Freud's psychoanalytic perspective viewed religion as the unconscious mind's need for wish fulfillment. Because people need to feel secure and absolve themselves of their own guilt, Freud believed that they choose to believe in God, who represents a powerful father-figure. Psycho analysis... id, ego super ego.. sexuality....

## The Moral Challenge

Slavery 1619-1865..... Biblically defended..."actually helpful to inferior people Some theologians said it was providence that had brought Africans to as slaves, since their enslavement would allow them to encounter the Christian message and thus their eternal souls would be saved.... others promoted the idea that Africans were the descendants of Ham, cursed in the book of Genesis, and thus their enslavement was fitting. Colossians, "slaves, obey your earthly master," <u>"slave Bible,"</u> published in 1807, which removed portions of Scripture including the Exodus story that could inspire rebellious thinking.

## **World Wars and the Atomic Bomb**




So called Christian nations fighting against each other.... Hitler and the Holocaust supported by the German Protestant Church

The American bombing of Dresden... and the atomic bombs on Japan decimating civilian populations




