Getting responses from the charities that the deacons give quarterly. <u>YCAP</u> reported a recent success story about a couple living in a double-wide manufactured home who had not applied for assistance since 2010. The water heater had partially fallen through the floor and the duct system was full of holes. Weatherization assistance sealed the ducts, insulated the floor and made repairs to the subfloor that placed the water heater back on solid surface. The estimated energy savings is predicted at 47% for this couple. They felt dramatically more comfortable and now look forward to "manageable" energy consumption from month to month,



Per Capita

Since 1755, Presbyterians have used a "per capita apportionment" to provide for the administrative expenses of our denomination. Some may call it a "tax" but should be understood as an apportionment of costs throughout the denomination on a per member basis.

In the early days it helped enable commissioners from all parts of the country to attend meetings of the General Assembly. Historically, and through present times, per capita apportionment has been used to fund those ecclesiastical functions essential to the continuance and decision-making process of governing bodies, whether at the Presbytery, Synod or General Assembly level.

A Presbytery has no source of per capita funding other than from the congregations within its bounds. Hence payment of a per capita obligation is properly considered as an equitable sharing of the responsibility of being in judicial, administrative and connectional relationship within our denomination. It is an obligation of shared responsibility within a covenantal community.

The policy of the Presbytery of the Cascades is that payment in full of per capita apportionment is due annually by January 31st; otherwise, a payment plan may be enacted by individual congregations and payment in full is made by September 30th. The latter is the usual course taken by Newberg FPC.

Per capita is billed on the basis of the congregational membership as reported to the General Assembly. For members of Newberg FPC, the monies collected are divided between the General Assembly, the Synod of the Pacific and the biggest part to the Presbytery of the Cascades.

The per capita fee for each member for fiscal year 2019 is \$35.50. To date, we have collected less than 60% of the per capita fees this year, which leaves it upon our church to come up with the monies to pay for the remainder of what's due. Although the current year's full payment has already been made, it means monies that could be used for other programs have been used to pay this bill.

I personally look on the per capita as my annual 'dues' – something I am expected to pay to help support our denomination beyond our church here in Newberg. So, have you paid your per capita for 2019? I am encouraging everyone who is proud to be a Presbyterian to take a moment and help us reach our goal of 100% per capita collected.
