

Mary Kalesse and Pastor Chris Murphy reported that they represented Newberg First Presbyterian as part of a cohort of ministers connected to the Thriving Congregations Initiative. Newberg First Presbyterian is grateful to be receiving a grant through this initiative of \$15,000 in 2022 and another grant of \$15,000 in 2023 to support our mission as a church. Thriving Congregations Initiative is part of the ministry of Portland Seminary.

Session regretfully removed from the rolls Lois Picard who passed away on 11/12/2020 and Elaine Johnsen who passed away on 12/3/2020. Session also received the sad news that Sylvia Stater has requested with daughter Megan Shaw to be moved to inactive. Membership as of December 8, 2020 is at 54. A final letter from our Mission partners Dennis and Maribel as they enter into retirement:

Dear Partners in God's Mission,

In October, after seven months of lockdown, Argentina finally opened airports to commercial flights. On Oct 12, Maribel and I jumped on a plane in Buenos Aires with our two Siamese cats and flew to Oregon to begin a new chapter in our life's journey.

After 43 years of service, I retired as a Presbyterian mission co-worker on Oct. 31, 2020. Through your friendship, prayers and financial support you have been our partners in mission for much of that time. Thank you!

As Maribel and I settle into life on the south coast of Oregon, we have been looking back and unpacking memories and reviewing lessons learned.

There was a time when we thought of mission as something Christians do – a function of our devotion or our commitment. Little by little we learned that wherever we went in mission, God was already there. In some mysterious way, every people of every tongue – despite our common brokenness – were embraced by common grace. We came to understand that we were called as servants of God's mission – not the mission of a particular local church, or even the Presbyterian Church (USA).

We learned that our task as mission workers was not to be God-bearers but to be fellow pilgrims discerning how and where God is present in every time and place. And how God was calling all of us to faithful service in building the common good. Christ is our model and Christ is our companion on the journey.

This is a strange time to begin this new chapter in our lives. Pandemic denies us the freedom even to be able to embrace friends and family. The U.S. and so many other countries are confronting deep divisions, grief at lost loved ones, social unrest, natural disasters – all exacerbated by COVID-19. It is a moment without closure, fraught with uncertainties. But this is the time in which we live.

As we enter Advent, Maribel and I wanted to send you this, our final mission newsletter, celebrating that the God of Hope continues to be born here, in human history. We thank you for all that we have shared together. We thank God for all that is to come.

Taliilee summarizes highlights of their ministry:

~Schools: Schools not open in this academic year due to covid19 and the military activity in the north. Some churches are meeting outdoors.

~Urgessa's travels: Urgessa is in Ethiopia as of the week of Dec. 7 and will be there until later in January. He reports that the work on the college is progressing slowly due to challenges in the political and military activities.

~Bible Translation: We continue to ask for funding to publish the complete Arsi Oromo bible. The manuscript is already sent to South Korea and we are praying we will have enough funding to publish it in 2021.

~Taliilee's ministry: Taliilee maintains a busy ministry schedule with Zoom meetings to congregations in Washington D.C., Denver, Minneapolis and Norway. She will also be participating with us as a Bible study leader in January.
