Summer Return to In-Person Worship

Wow! We are getting closer to meeting in person. At our April Session meeting, our elders determined we are ready to begin in-person worship at a limited capacity on Sunday, June 13th. Our church has purposefully taken a cautious approach during this pandemic. Now that all adults are eligible to receive vaccines and with the support of the Cascades Presbytery, we are ready to re-open.

I know we are all excited to see each other and experience community in a more holistic way as we return to in-person worship. As your pastor, I have missed you and I have missed seeing everyone each Sunday. Thanks to the wonders of technology and the gifts of Gary and Paul Buck, Noah Katterman, and other volunteers we have learned to worship together with the help of live-stream. We have also found community with the help of Zoom gatherings. Until last year neither the words Zoom nor live-stream worship felt like every-day vocabulary. In-person worship was what we called normal worship. The world has certainly changed but we are ready to return to some normalcy. I am relieved and thrilled at the same time.

So, what can we expect this summer? Although we are ready for in-person worship on June 13th, we will be taking appropriate precautions that fit with CDC guidelines. We think it is best to begin with limited capacity. We will have survey results that help us know who is ready to return. What we will plan to do is sit in family groups for those of us who normally come to church with a friend or family member. Also, we plan to space the rows to better create 6 feet of distance from each other. We are asking you to wear masks throughout the service, but we will allow worship leaders and preachers to take off masks when speaking. Although singing will be allowed, the choir will be postponed until at least the Fall season to avoid singing as a group in the front choir pews. As an extra precaution we will have everyone who enters the sanctuary for worship sign in and we will do extra cleaning between worship services. The Worship, Music, Media, and Technology committee will create a document with protocols before June. Remember, even when in person worship occurs, Live-stream will continue as well for those who wish to watch online.

The sanctuary and office will be open beginning June 13th, but we are choosing not to meet in the fellowship hall after worship. After worship services, people will be encouraged to gather and visit outside with proper social distancing and the use of masks. The hope is that we can enjoy some summer picnics on the lawn, but normally we will not offer refreshments after worship.

Thanks for going on this journey with us through the pandemic and as we re-open to in-person worship June 13th. May God give us grace as we come together once again to worship Jesus as one community. Thank God that we are ready for a new beginning and that God has held us through this challenging season.





Greetings in Christ from your Clerk of Session, April, 2021

This month we began with devotions by Bob Andrews and then listened to the LLC interested session meeting in working with us to move a duplex from Friendsview Manor on to our back lot. After the

meeting with this local LLC and months of careful considerations we decided it was not the right time to enter into a business in which we had limited voting power and which would require our church to legally join an LLC. We learned a lot in this process and know God has plans for the back lot which we are still working to discern. We approved the Treasurer's report for March.

A second focus of our meeting was discussing when and how to begin meeting in person at church again. All of us want to be safe and worship together so it was decided that worship in a limited capacity will begin again Sunday, June 13. To insure we keep to our limited capacity we will work on a sign up procedure and online church will run at the same time so that our whole church body can be worshipping together safely.

Celebrations we praised God for were our three baptisms this month, \$935 donated for Lentin food boxes, and our church beginning an Intentional Visioning process, "Living in the present and planning for the future as we celebrate the past."

We approved Pastor Chris' vacation leave and discussed ways to prune the arborvitae next to the parking lot lawn so that the neighbor's yard can receive more sunlight. Finance and Facilities is working to find a way to tackle those along with taking down any unsafe ornamental plum trees along Mission Street.

Pledge giving has decreased \$46,820 from 2019, but our church bank account balance is in a better place than three years ago due to our capital campaign, endowment funds for salaries, and grants. Our amazing Treasurer, Doug King, has specifics on areas we need to financially sheer up as the loss in pledges makes a big difference once we move back into full staff and full operations of buildings after covid restrictions are lifted. We have invited Doug to meet with Session to help us all become more enlightened on our current financials.

In May, Session will be meeting to discuss installing Pastor Chris as our permanent pastor versus our stated supply pastor.

Our next Session meeting is May 4th at 6:30 pm due to Pastor Chris and family going on vacation the next week.

Taliilee and Urgessa





Taliilee and Urgessa are Mission Partners that facilitate Light of Hope Ministry in both Ethiopia and the US.

Light of Hope Ministry Ethiopia (LOHME), is reaching out to over 10 million Arsi Oromo people. The ministry approach is holistic, focusing on literacy, health, church planting, Bible translation and evangelism among this Muslim people group. Teams of teacher-evangelists are trained and sent to villages that want a school in their community. Teachers build peaceful relationships between Muslims and emerging followers of Jesus and seek to plant churches that reflect the forms and traditions of the local culture.

An important feature is that the schools refrain from teaching religion, thus making education available to all students. Muslim parents don't hesitate to send their children for a much-desired education because they will not be dissuaded from their own religion.

Taliilee has an active church ministry visiting Oromo congregations in several large US metropolitan cities in addition to making periodic visits to Ethiopia. Urgessa has significant administrative duties in Ethiopia with oversight of construction of the academy and school construction which takes him out of the country more frequently.

LOHME also trains nurses and other health professionals to work in village health stations while sharing the Gospel with the communities they serve. Funds help build and furnish village schools and Light of Hope Academy, a Christian training college for nurses and teacher-evangelists, while also providing scholarships for college students and support for Bible translation work in the Arsi Oromo language. The list below shows the many facets of their ministry and opportunities to contribute to their support. Our church contributes \$125 each month to the total ministry.

- **Arsi Bible Translation:** Funds for this project subsidize the salaries of the translation team and provide for the publication, purchase and distribution of print and digital audio Bibles.
- **ESL Training:** Funds for this project cover the course curriculum materials to teach English to LOHME teachers, evangelists and high school students.
- **Ethno Music**: Funds for this project support recording, duplication and distribution expenses for contextualized Gospel music in the Arsi Oromo language.
- **Light of Hope Academy:** Funds support the construction of this training school, which will equip teachers and nurses to reach the Arsi Oromo people with a holistic Gospel.
- **Primary School Building Fund:** Many Arsi Oromo children lack education because there are no schools within walking distance of their villages. This project constructs schools requested by communities, creating educational opportunities as well as open doors for LOHME teacher-evangelists to share the Good News of Jesus in the villages where they are placed.
- School Desks: Funds for this project furnish 200 desks for every four-classroom LOHME school.
- Teacher Salary: Funds for this project subsidize the salary for LOHME-trained teachers to staff new


