

The Good News of the Gospel

This summer is an exciting time for our church as we return to In Person worship on June 13th. As we enter this new season, we are going to explore in our summer sermon series the theme of the Good News of the Gospel. What exactly is the Gospel? The word gospel translated from the Koine Greek is evangelion or good news. One simple definition of the Gospel is the good news of God's love revealed in the person of Jesus.

Many Christians these days are worried about the future of the Church. Less people in the United States are attending worship and although the pandemic has provided alternative ways to worship virtually many of us are out of the habit of church. Maybe now more than ever it is a good time to remind us of the meaning and purpose of the Gospel. Why is the Gospel good news?

The Gospel or good news of Jesus is that God became a human being and made himself known to us in a personal way. Jesus shows us what God cares about and what we are called to care about in this world. The Gospel is all about God's love for the world. Many of us also grew up with a simple understanding of the Gospel as God's way of providing fire insurance. In other words, we understood the Gospel as the belief that by accepting Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior we can avoid going to hell for all eternity. The Gospel became defined as principally Jesus saving people from sin and hell through his death on the cross.

Although this definition highlights one way of understanding the ministry of Jesus, a full understanding of the Gospel highlights the values of God including God's heart for the oppressed and those on the margins of society. In other words, the Gospel refers to the ways God's love is revealed in the life and ministry of Jesus on earth. His healings and his wise teachings are significant parts of the Gospel. His friendships and his deep intimacy with his Father in Heaven are examples of good news. Eternal life and salvation are also key but not the only way to understand the Gospel.

May this summer inspire us to deepen our relationship with God as we explore the beauty of the Gospel. The Gospel of God's love revealed in Jesus can bring us a deep sense of purpose and joy in these days. As we embrace the good news of the Gospel, we are invited as the church to vision for the future. On Friday, June 11th from 6:30 PM to 8:30 PM everyone in our church community is invited to participate in a special visioning conversation about the future of our church. Then on June 12th the Session and Deacons will be meeting from 9 AM to 12 Noon to reflect on your ideas and chart some next steps for how we live out the Gospel as a worshipping community. We will be sending you the Zoom link for these gatherings soon. May the Spirit of Christ guide our visioning as a church as we seek to embody the good news of Jesus.

Bob and Gracie Ekblad





Bob and Gracie Ekblad are co-founders and pastors of Tierra Nueva and The People's Seminary in Burlington, Washington. Bob holds a ThD in Old Testament, and Gracie holds a Masters of Theology from the Institut Protestant de Théologie, Montpellier, France. Both Bob and Gracie are ordained ministers in the Presbyterian Church (USA). Bob has taught at The Seattle School of Theology and Psychology, Westminster Theological Centre (UK), Regent College and is the author of "Reading the Bible with the Damned", "A New Christian Manifesto: Pledging Allegiance to the Kingdom of God", "The Beautiful Gate: Enter Jesus' Global Liberation Movement", and "Guerrilla Gospel: Reading the Bible for Liberation in the Power of the Spirit."

The Ekblads have many facets to their ministry, including The People's Seminary. The People's Seminary is a learning center for scripture study and theology, rooted in active ministry in solidarity with people on the margins. Theological education that connects people from the mainstream with people on the margins reveals a gospel that is active and powerful, enabling both groups to discover their vocation and serve together as Christ's body in the world.

Led by Tierra Nueva founders Bob and Gracie Ekblad in Burlington, Washington, The People's Seminary equips followers of Jesus to proclaim and embody liberating messages of transformation to the excluded. The Ekblads are joined by other Tierra Nueva staff as well as local and international instructors.

What You Can Expect from The People's Seminary:

Community: The course emphasizes mutual support and sharing of best practices. Participants journey as a cohort through the one-year program. On site, we eat and study together each day. Between modules, the online community fosters peer relationships.

Inclusive teaching styles: Each module includes lecture, worship, practical reflection, ministry opportunities, and group discussion. There will be recommended reading before each gathering.

Robust curriculum: The course weaves together five key themes related to ministry on the margins:

- 1. God's identity and mission—and ours
- 2. Healing and holistic liberation—biblical foundations and principles
- 3. Social prophetic mission—justice, advocacy, and peacemaking
- 4. Word on the street—preparing and leadings transformational Bible studies
- 5. Practical reflection—how does this work in my life and ministry?

The People's Seminary also offers a "Certificate in Transformational Ministry at the Margins." The Certificate is specifically designed for those already serving/pioneering work in (or on behalf of) poor and marginalized communities. It will bring together 'word', 'spirit' and 'street' perspectives in order to encourage and further equip practitioners wanting to live and share a liberating/empowering gospel with those excluded from economic, social, political and cultural mainstreams.

Providence Medical Center is raising funds to purchase Panda Warmers for the Birth Center. Panda Warmers are used in every birth to stabilize the temperature of newborns and provide any necessary resuscitation support a baby might need. They have to replace all of the warmers at the same time, so their fundraising goal is \$123,000. In partnership with Love INC

First Presbyterian Church partners with Love INC in providing bikes to eligible clients. These clients are screened by Love INC to determine need and eligibility. Many times people who are getting back on their feet need to have more reliable transportation than their feet.

The bikes allow their new owners to more easily get to jobs and/or school, arrive at doctor, dentist, or job interview appointments easily, and make shopping more convenient.

First Presbyterian's Bike Ministry takes in donated bikes, delivers them to the Retired Recyclers for repair and rehab, and, once the bikes are returned all fixed up, serves as a distribution point for Love INC clients to choose the bike best suited to them.
