

Welcome to Advent



Advent is a special season in the church liturgical calendar practiced by many Christian denominations. Advent comes from the Latin word Adventus, which means coming. It is a season where we wait for the coming of the Christ child, the promised Messiah Jesus. It is a time to remember the gift of God becoming one of us, the great mystery of the incarnation. It is also a season for us to remember all the blessings from the previous year and to show love to one another through gifts and celebrations. It is an opportunity to especially remember the most vulnerable in our world.

Probably like many of you as we come to the Season of Advent, I have mixed feelings. On the one hand I am excited to prepare for the birth of Jesus and the celebration of Christmas. I look forward to seeing my daughters open their stockings and joining with family and friends for times of worship and tasty meals with joyful conversation. I enjoy reflecting on the beauty of Christ's birth.

WOW! An order was made to Equal Exchange Monday November 22 for 12 Solidarity Boxes and 13 Chocolate Boxes plus a few other EE items. I'm ecstatic and say THANK YOU! for small farmer cooperatives in Nicaragua, Peru, Egypt, Panama, India, and the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Your response is TERRIFIC! The order must come from Equal Exchange's headquarters in West Bridgeport, Massachusetts (near Boston) and will takes 10 days for delivery. You will be notified by e-mail when the order arrives, and it can be picked up either during office hours at the church, or Sunday after service. My hope is that it will be Sunday December 5th. Payment is due at time of pickup. Write checks to First Presbyterian Church. Why? I buy with the church credit card.

I must have hit the right button when attempting to both teach about the Presbyterian Coffee Project and introduce Equal Exchange products. My thought was, it's gift giving season and both the Solidary Box and Assorted Chocolate Bar Box make excellent gifts. And, by displaying their contents I would be able to show an array of EE merchandise. HOORAY! It worked. My goal in 2022 is to introduce EE's complete product line and the process for ordering, in addition to fleshing out more fully EE's alternative trade model.

When it is possible to return to the Fellowship Hall, as you enter the room, look to the right at the bulletin board on the wall. There hangs a Coffee Project display put up prior to Covid shut down. What it says is as true today as it was two years ago.

2021 in Review from Caroline Kurtz, Maji Development Coalition

The regional hospital, serving several districts and 60,000 people, got power. MDC's solar partner delivered and installed the panels and batteries as Covid restrictions on travel in Ethiopia were lifted. The hospital was dedicated in late August with fanfare, speeches, and a fundraiser. Local communities expressed their own commitment to the hospital by donating almost \$50,000 for further improvements.

As a thank you for my contributions to Maji's welfare, I hear I was granted a plot of land! Let me remind youwhen they thank me, they are thanking you. I'm the face they've come to know only because I can't take you all to Maji with me and introduce you to the people you've loved so well.





The hospital and district administration planned a big event and invited leaders from districts around, plus officials from zone and state.



The Maji town water system's modern digital dispensers were installed in July. First ever in Ethiopia! Thank you to Yonas Workie of SunTransfer Tech.

The WISHES program added a fourth pilot self-help group for women. All are saving money regularly, and a public health nurse is giving sanitation training at their meetings. Your gifts this summer will allow us to match their first \$250 and start a revolving fund to support them further





Women of all ages have joined WISHES (Women in Self-Help Empowerment Societies). They are hopeful that MDC will help them make lasting changes in their families' fortunes.
