

House of Prayer

How wonderful to celebrate Easter last month! We decorated our cross and placed it on College St. for our community to be reminded of the beauty of the resurrection of Jesus. I feel this Easter Season is special for our church because we are experiencing new life. If we include livestream viewing, we had over 100 people join us on Easter Sunday.

I shared during the Easter service, that God is encouraging many of us in the congregation these days to devote ourselves to prayer. Just as the disciples were told by Jesus to dedicate themselves to prayer in preparation for the coming of the Holy Spirit, so our church community is being called to prayer.

What would it mean for Newberg First Presbyterian Church to be a House of Prayer for our Newberg community? One expression of this calling we wish to explore is for us to use our church campus for monthly prayer retreats.

On Friday, May 6th we will begin our first monthly prayer retreat. We will meet the first Friday of each month from 9 AM to 12 noon at our church's campus, followed by a light lunch. We will provide prayer retreat materials that will be available at the retreat and will also be sent by email for those who wish to participate from home or work.

In the book of Isaiah 56: 7, we read, "These I will bring to my holy mountain, and make them joyful in my house of prayer; their burnt offerings and their sacrifices will be accepted on my altar; for my house shall be called a house of prayer for all nations." Quoting Isaiah, Jesus says in Mark 11: 17, "Is it not written, 'My house shall be called a house of prayer for all the nations'? Friends, I sense Jesus is leading us to be a house of prayer in Newberg. Please pray for God to lead us in this area of mission.

Easter Season in our church calendar lasts from Easter day to Pentecost Sunday on June 5th. May the month of May be a time for us to devote ourselves to prayer as we seek to experience a greater anointing of the Holy Spirit on our lives and on the mission of our church here in Newberg and throughout our world. God has great plans for us!



It is with great sadness that both the Remnant Initiatives Conference scheduled for May 14th and the Tuesday night Community Dinners have been cancelled. Unfortunately, Remnant Initiatives is closing their doors permanently because they couldn't get consistent funding. The board of directors for RI sent out the following information:

On April 19, 2022, the board of directors of Remnant Initiatives made the very difficult decision to dissolve the nonprofit. Since our inception we knew that sustainability of the organizational mission was dependent on a varied donor base (including consistent government support), and a robust group of volunteers who would walk alongside our returning neighbors over time.

Like so many other organizations, the COVID-19 pandemic greatly disrupted government funding and volunteer engagement for us. After two years of intense commitment to keeping the organization afloat, the leadership team has come to realize that this is no longer possible. Thus, we find ourselves in the very tough reality of accepting our status as another COVID casualty.

I know we're all sorry about losing this opportunity to care for all of God's children. I hope you'll keep this community in your prayers.

WITH APPRECIATION

To ALL who placed an order for Equal Exchange products in the month of April I give a BIG THANK YOU. The thanks are not only from me but also, the farmers who labor to produce the coffee cherries and cacao pods and their cooperatives with which EE partners. Two orders were placed, one for \$511.20 and the other for \$474.00, totaling \$984.20. This is remarkable since over the years average annual sales have been in the range of \$2,500 to \$3,000!! And remember, during the month of April EE gifted 10% of the payments to the Peace and Justice Ministry of PCUSA for the Hunger Program. That totals \$98.42. (Too bad \$1.58 can't be added.)

While orders are made by the case, the Coffee Cart remains open on Sundays during Fellowship for individual sales of packaged coffees, and I shall continue to place case orders monthly if totals reach \$136 (free shipping). Chocolate tasting and ordering will be postponed until fall. I plan over the summer to introduce EE TEA. There are Black Teas, Green Teas, and Herbal Teas, all in tea bag form. During Fellowship a basket with a variety of bags will be on the condiment table by the coffee and hot water pots. I encourage all tea drinkers to look and select a bag to steep and taste.

Mission Partner News

On Tuesday nights from 10:00-11:00pm I've been leading a Bible study to a group of Russian men in a recovery house near Krasnodar in Southwest Russia near the Black Sea—a four-hour drive from the Ukrainian border. It's 8:00am Wednesday morning there.

The men gather around a big screen TV in their living room. I can't see all of them as their camera isn't wide angle enough to take them all in. This particular evening I made an effort to include a good friend named Larry, a Native American man in his early 50s who lives up-river from us in a remote town.

Larry has spent many years in prison and is currently out of jail on bail. I had told the Russian recovery guys about him, and they wanted to meet him. He too was excited to meet them. He's never used Zoom, so I had to help him download it and get connected an hour or so before.

All of these men, including Larry, had been drug addicts. Most had also spent time in prison. The men immediately responded, and Ilya interpreted back to us.

"So, let's see what Jesus tells us in John 10:1 about someone entering the sheep pen in a way other than the door," I say, inviting someone to re-read this verse. Ilya spoke out what I'd said in Russian, and one of the Russians read.

We wrap up our time together speaking out to Jesus how we are drawn to him as our shepherd. There's a tenderness and delight, and Ilya is visibly moved.

I am amazed at how our very experience on Zoom that night illustrated Jesus' parable. The Russian recovery guys receive me, since they already know me. They also received Larry, since he's my friend.

There to the South of a violent, forceful invasion in neighboring Ukraine, the kingdom of God was being respectfully presented and welcomed, and we were all feeling invited to follow Jesus into freedom.

Mission Partners Brian and Julie had this note regarding their work in the region:

Our Group Director gave the following statement: *"Thank you for remembering our work and the people of Ukraine and Russia in prayer. Our international staff have left the region, and none of our colleagues are in danger. But our colleagues and partners in Russia have projects or friends and family in Ukraine, and they are grieved by current events. Please pray for peace. Pray for the health and safety of Ukraine." He also asks prayer for local colleagues within Russia who "are also beginning to experience the serious repercussions of international sanctions. Pray that God will provide for their livelihoods and ministries. Pray that we will find creative and effective solutions to support them and their ongoing work."*

ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

We once again thank our generous congregation for your offerings to the OGHS at Eastertime.

We were able to send \$894.00 to our Presbyterian Church (USA) - "headquarters" - for the work of the church, serving people in need at home and abroad – this year, most specifically, Ukraine!

The offerings are divided as: 36% is received by Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, while Self-Development of People and the Presbyterian Hunger Program each receive 32%!


Keep on Learning!
