Peace, Unity, and Love in Newberg

Last month I preached a sermon about the Holy Trinity's heart of love. At the end of my sermon, I shared an image that came to me in prayer. I described how people often identify either on the left or the right, but that we are invited to put our left and right hands together and curve them in to form a heart of love.

To me this is a picture for our church's mission in Newberg and the way of Jesus in the world. We can hold our different perspectives theologically, spiritually, socially, and politically, but what makes us a people of grace, hope, and love, is our willingness to come to the center in relationship with a heart of love. Maybe our church can model this call to bring peace, unity, and love to Newberg.

This will feel countercultural and initially hard, but in my experience most of us are looking for examples of people who come together with a desire to listen and learn from one another, even as we maintain our different perspectives.

One of the gifts of the Presbyterian Church (USA) is that we are a big tent. Our denomination models a heart for social justice and inclusion, but also a willingness to share the message of Jesus to those who do not know him. We love Jesus and justice. We care about spiritual formation and social concern. We are non-partisan in our mission, while supporting those who are oppressed.

One way God calls us to come together in unity, is to begin with a heart of humility. It is so easy to get passionate about one's conviction on any topic and to then begin to get angry at someone else's position or perspective. When we realize that every human being is sacred, we can take a posture of humility and choose to love our neighbor as ourselves and open ourselves to relationship with anyone and everyone.

Who is God calling you to love? How might we come to the center with a heart of humility as we seek to model a church that brings peace to Newberg. On our Peace Pole in our Newberg Peace Garden, we read the words of Mother Teresa, "Peace begins with a smile." May God show us how to be kind, gracious, and hopeful as we foster peace in our town, nation, and world. As we continue our pilgrimage with Jesus this summer may we come together in love and model this love to others.

How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!

Several weeks ago, from our pulpit, an Indian pastor, Divikar Undurthi told of his dream to have a permanent home for his orphanage. His dream is to turn a piece of ground beside his church into facilities to serve his community in several ways:

- The primary goal is a structure for an existing orphanage currently in a temporary shelter.
- It would provide space for small shops that would house merchants and provide rental funds for the church.
- Create a future medical clinic.

We want to raise \$3000 this summer to assist Divakar in his dream.

Our biannual AIA Staff Conference gathered 350 staff at our headquarters in Xenia, Ohio. With Acts 17 as our central Scripture we were fed by daily worship, plenary sessions in the word, seminars led by our staff addressing the spectrum of personal and ministry needs, interactive vision, strategic planning and team building.



Linsey, our Staff Care Director played a significant role in the conference, coordinating all the seminars to address both the felt needs and the gospel foundations underlying each of them. Our team got to help lead many of these.

Erik and Lynn led a session on working together across five generations. Missionary cross cultural principles work here too—valuing people God made in his image, seeking to understand their defining stories, valuing their strengths, seeking to resolve or bridge the differences with grace and respect.

Both Erik and I spent meal times and afternoon breaks in individual appointments addressing encouragement, career planning, healing of hurting relationships, theological development, transfer planning.... Though the days were long and some of the meetings were weighty, Erik had a lot of energy and praised God for how he was able to speak life and truth. (I think it was fulfilling to do more of the personal side of ministry because he often has to work on the policy and problem side, which doesn't always have tangible or quick results.)

On a personal note: We're incredibly thankful that Erik's blood work is still clear after 3rd quarterly testing. Kristianna just finished her first year at University of Cincinnati. She also received the unexpected honor of an award for "an outstanding freshman chemistry major with great potential" which comes with a scholarship!

Your prayers are powerful and effective, we are thankful for how God is working in places where human strength and influence fails but his does not,


